

The Take Me Home system is a free database that is maintained by the Paola Police Department and is only accessible by law enforcement personnel. The system includes a picture, demographic information and caregiver contacts. If a person in the Take Me Home system is found alone, an officer can query the Take Me Home system by name or by the person's description to locate the person's Take Me Home enrollment record. With the information at hand the officer can appropriately assist the person in getting them home.





The Paola Police Department is committed to providing the best service to your loved one as we can. Any child or adult with a developmental or cognitive disability and may have difficulty communicating while lost or in an emergency situation can enroll. These individuals are at a higher risk for wandering and will likely be contacted by an officer. They can include people with disabilities such as Alzheimer's, Autism, Dementia, Down syndrome, Traumatic Brain Injury, etc.



The Take Me Home program was started by the Pensacola Florida Police Department in 2003. It was produced in conjunction with the Autism Society's Safe and Sound Initiative in an effort to better serve a specific portion of the community and help first responders effectively serve them.
